

Dear Parents

All schools in Australia are required to take part in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on school students requiring extra support and or adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students. This is aimed at providing all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students needing extra support.

You can choose if you want your child's information to be included in the data collection or not. No names or identifying information are collected as part of the collection process.

The data collection will involve the collection of the following information at the school level:

- The number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- The level of adjustments provided (no adjustment at this time, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment)
- Where known the student's type of difficulty

Once this data has been collated, it will be de-identified and aggregated at the system level (ie Primary, Secondary, Special and Combined school setting) before providing it to the Commonwealth Department of Education. This ensures that no student's identity can be ascertained.

The data will be used by our school to inform and improve practice for students requiring extra support by the Department for Education and Child Development to inform statewide reform initiatives. The Australian Government of Education will use the information collected for the purposes of preparing reports for briefing Education Ministers. The aggregated data may also be used to inform national policy development.

As previously stated student data involvement in the NCCD project is optional. If you do not want our school to provide de-identified data about your child to the Australian Government Department of Education, you can 'opt –out' by contacting Rebecca Bailey-Brown (inclusion and Diverse Learning Teacher) at school.

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on Students with Disability Education Programs - Special Learning Needs

CSNSW will be the central agency for the National Collection of Data for Students with Disabilities for Dioceses and Congregational schools in New South Wales.

The National Collection process involves an understanding of the requirements under the DDA and analysis of personal student adjustments. This is recorded on the CSNSW website in the form of a Personalised Plan. With respect to the Nationally Consistent Collection of data this process began in some schools in October 2013. Diocesan Disability Advisers are aware of this process and requirements for the NSW Catholic Schools and should be contacted where personnel in Diocesan schools have questions.

The National Data Collection process is similar in concept and purpose to the CSNSW 'Personalised Planning' (PPSD) process with which NSW Catholic Education Offices and Congregational schools have been engaged. CSNSW will assist in any necessary moderation of adjustment levels and submit the data to the Australian Government Department of Education in Canberra, on behalf of Diocesan and Congregational schools in NSW.

The data submitted to the Australian Government Department of Education will be drawn from the Personalised Plan (PPSD) database on the first Friday in August.

The following student information will be collected at the school level through PPSD on an annual basis:

- · The level of adjustment provided;
- Number of students receiving each level of adjustment to participate in education on the same basis as other students; and
- The student's type(s) of disability

A number of resources have been developed at the national level to provide an overview of the rationale for the Model, the broader policy and reform context an overview of the implementation approach and timeframes.

The website http://education.gov.au/nationally-consistent-collection-data-school-students-disabilty has been established as a 'one-stop' resource for all information about the data collection. It will be reviewed and updated throughout the phased implementation.

School staff are also able to access the nationally available resource for principals and school teams developed by Educational Services Australia available at www.schooldisabilitydatapl.edu.au. This resource identifies and guides participants through the steps that CSNSW will support in the data collection process. All staff may access the eLearning course for Disability Standards for Education under the DDA https://www.schooldisabilitydatapl.edu.au.

Compliance requirements:

Students personalised plans must be accurate as at 9am on Friday 2nd August 2018. Diocesan offices will advise Principal of system 'sign off' requirements.
